The UWF Wednesday Bible Study is in the midst of an Advent daily devotional called *Light from Afar* ending January 8. Each of the four weeks is written by someone from another continent.

The third week is written by Nadiyka Gerbish from Ukraine. The title for the week was "JOY." Wow! JOY in war torn Ukraine—after almost two years of devastation? Nadiyka's words are heartfelt and true despite the country's strife. She says, "When you remain actively sensitive to the vulnerable around you—the weak, the weary, the depressed, the wounded,—you have no inner resources for hatred." Ukrainian soldiers often say, "We are not fighting because of hate for our enemies but out of love for our families, our homes, and our land."

Hatred might be a mighty fuel, but it runs out soon. Love is the fuel that remains, multiplies, overflows, and roots us in eternity. She offers this prayer, "Vulnerable God, we stand before you, just as we are, known and loved by you. We trust you with the outcome of circumstances beyond our control. Amen." Let us embrace the JOY she feels and share our love by praying for the Ukrainians and all living in situations beyond their control here and abroad in the new year.
